Dear Parent/Carer

When I wrote to you this time last year we were getting ready to welcome the children back to school with a great sense of joy following a long period of isolation. They have now been back to school for two terms and are making excellent progress. Easter is always a time of great joy, the days are getting warmer and longer, and there is a lot to celebrate and look forward to. I hope you enjoy reading our Spring Newsletter which outlines some of the wonderful things achieved by our pupils and staff.

On Wednesday we had our first Whole School Worship in over two years; it was a very emotional event, not only because it was the final time our Year 11 pupils will be together with the whole school, but to see the school community together brought great joy to all.

St. Hild's Church of England School joined the NEAT academy trust a year ago and forged a positive working partnership which has seen the school make rapid progress, particularly over the past two terms. Our corridors and social areas are calm, and classrooms purposeful. However we are never complacent, and constantly strive to improve our provision so your child can experience Life in all its fullness and strive to achieve academic excellence.

To continue on our journey of improvement, we will be making changes to our Behaviour Policy in the summer term to ensure all pupils are able to make as much progress as possible in their lessons, and support and intervention is swift and targeted. The policy, and a summary of the key changes will be shared with pupils and parents and carers early in the summer term before the changes are introduced.

One change we will be putting in place immediately on return after the Easter holidays is the banning of mobile phones from the school. This decision is supported by Governors and has not been taken lightly. We strongly believe this is the right decision in order to support your child's mental health and well-being and to ensure all pupils are properly safeguarded whilst in school. Mobile phones must not be visible in school, and if seen they will be confiscated and we will then require a parent or carer to collect the phone from school.

The summer term, which begins on Monday 25th April 2022 is an exciting time at St. Hild's, with lots to look forward to, including Awards' Ceremonies, Alternative Curriculum Day, Year 5 and 6 Transition Days, House Competitions, and Year 11 Leavers' events which include the much awaited Prom. We expect all pupils to return safe and well rested, in full school uniform (see the website for our Uniform Policy) and ready to learn.
